

# **CHC50113 Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care**

Educating and Supporting our Community

The Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care is delivered over an 18 month period. It requires a combination of classroom attendance and 240 hours of work placement. Additional home-based study will be required.

Students will learn both the theoretical and hands on skills to work as competent, caring and professional early childhood educators. The course covers caring for children and their families, work place health and safety, programming for and with children, and interacting environment.

### **Career Opportunities**

This qualification reflects the role of Early Childhood Educators who are responsible for designing and implementing curriculum in Early Childhood Education and Care Services. They may have responsibility for supervision of volunteers or other staff.

Positions may include:

- Early Childhood Educator Centre Based
- **Playgroup Supervisor**
- Family Day Care Worker
- Child Care Educator Centre Based
- Nanny
- Sessional Kindergarten Assistant
- Long Day Care Kindergarten Assistant

#### **Learning Resources**

All equipment and resources are provided for students enrolling in this qualification including textbooks, learner guides, student handouts and assessment instructions at no additional cost. Students have access to computers and training resources.

#### **Mode of Delivery**

This course is delivered face-to-face in a classroom based learning environment. This mode of delivery will combine theory-based material and practical tasks.



## Who is this qualification for?

This qualification covers educators in children's services who are responsible for planning, implementing and managing programs in early childhood services, in accordance with licensing, and within the requirements of the Education and Care Services National Regulations and the National Quality Standard.

### **Entry Requirements**

There are no formal entry requirements for this qualification. You will be expected to have suitable language, literacy, numeracy and communication skills needed to undertake the qualification. Students are required to undertake a language, literacy and numeracy assessment.

#### **Course Requirements**

Students are required to complete a minimum of 240 hours of practical placement in an Early Childhood Setting with children aged 0-6 years. Settings may include Long Day Care, Occasional Care, Kindergarten, and/or Pre-School. Students who choose Kindergarten/ Pre-School settings will also need to complete up to 30 hours in an infant/toddler setting.
