Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care

This course will allow you to begin a rewarding career in early childhood education. You will learn the theoretical knowledge and hands on skills to become competent, caring and professional early childhood educators to support children's wellbeing, learning and development.

This qualification will allow you to work in a range of early childhood education and care settings including:

- Childcare educator
- Playgroup supervisor
- Family Daycare worker
- Kindergarten assistant

DELIVERY METHOD

Delivery of this course is via face-to-face classes (in person or virtual) and will be supported by our Learning Management System. All equipment and resources are provided for learners enrolling in this course.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Individuals undertaking this course will be expected to have suitable language, literacy, numeracy and communication skills, and be required to undertake a Pre-Training Review and Language, Literacy and Numeracy Assessment.

Students undertaking the course will be required to obtain or hold a current Working with Children's check to enable participation in the practical placement component of the course. A volunteer Working with Children's Check is free.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Learners are required to complete a minimum of 160 hours of practical placement in a regulated Early Childhood Education and Care setting with children aged 0-6.

Cobram Community House is responsible for organising practical placement.
