Certificates in General Education for Adults

The Certificates in General Education for Adults support the development of literacy and numeracy skills to enable learners to meet immediate needs, participate in the community, access further learning and study pathways or gain employment.

22690VIC

Certificate I in General Education for Adults



This course is designed for people who wish to improve their skills or to further general education studies. You will learn basic reading, writing, maths and computer skills to develop your confidence and help you explore further training options or vocational pathways.

22691VIC

Certificate II in General Education for Adults



This course is ideal for people who wish to consolidate their skills to increase employment opportunities or go onto further study. You will develop the confidence to read, interpret, evaluate and create complex texts and apply numeracy in a range of contexts.

22692VIC

Certificate III in General Education for Adults



This course will help you to develop skills to read, interpret, critically analyse and create highly complex texts. You will also gain confidence in performing a broad range of complex mathematical tasks. This certificate is designed for people looking to advance their skills for the workplace or to go onto further study.



WHO IS THIS COURSE FOR?

This course is for a range of learners who wish to improve their literacy, basic math and general education skills, including those who left mainstream education early, and whose life experiences have inhibited access to education, training and employment.

The main focus of the Certificates in General Education for Adults is to build:

- life skills
- literacy skills
- numeracy skills
- digital skills

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this qualification. You will be expected to have suitable language, literacy, numeracy and communication skills needed to undertake the course. An interview and pre-course assessment is conducted prior to enrolment for all potential students to determine the most appropriate course of study for enrolment.

DELIVERY METHOD

Delivery of this course is via face-to-face classes at Cobram Community House.

Special Interest electives: 3 units


